They also sent it on to other friends and relatives, and it has since spread around the world, with alterations as it has spread.

I see the countless Christmas trees around the world below with tiny lights, like Heaven's stars, reflecting on the snow the sight is so spectacular, please wipe away the tear for I am spending Christmas with Jesus Christ this year.

I hear the many Christmas songs
that people hold so dear



Lifepath: David Livingstone

Blantyre's most famous son, David Livingstone, was born on 19 March 2013 and next year a number of different events to celebrate the bicentenary of his birth are being planned, including a service with the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland at the Livingstone

Memorial Parish Church in March.

A year ago the Hamilton and Blantyre Mission Committee of Hamilton Presbytery asked Jen Robertson (the Schools and Churches Youth Development Worker) about ways in which better support could be offered to the David Livingstone Centre by local churches. This has led to a partnership between the Calderside Learning Community Chaplaincy Team and the staff at David Livingstone Centre to create a programme for second year pupils of both Calderside Academy and John



Ogilvie High School that will explore the life and faith of David Livingstone called 'LIfepath'. In thinking about and experiencing something of Livingstone's spiritual life journey the pupils will be encouraged to think and reflect on their own spiritual journey.

This is inspired by some programmes that Scripture Union has developed in Cathedrals in England that take the life of a special historic person of faith in that particular community and give an opportunity for young people to think about the impact that faith had on that person's life. Whereas these have been generally targeted at primary aged children, our own event is aimed at an older group of young people.

The programme is based around the four key themes that Calderside

Academy adopted as their core values this year (if you have been into the school recently you will have seen huge new banners with these words): reliable, respectful, responsible, resilient.

Over the course of a week in June next year we will have around 400 pupils attend the David Livingstone Centre where they will have the opportunity to learn about Livingstone's formative years in Blantyre led by the staff at the Centre, a chance to explore (literally as this will take place all over the grounds) and experience Livingstone's mission in Africa led by the chaplaincy team, and finally to think about the ongoing legacy of Livingstone's faith, mission and work in a workshop that Christian Aid will be leading.

It is going to be an amazing week, and a brilliant way to engage hundreds of young people in learning about Livingstone, celebrating his legacy and thinking about what this all means for us today. And in case you were wonder... there will be opportunities for you to get involved as we will be looking for volunteers to help out each day, so watch this space!


EVENTSDifferent Voices

An event for everyone interested in using music to enhance the life of church and community.

Friday 15th March 7:00pm – Saturday 16th March 18:00pm

£40 per ticket (Lunch and refreshments are included in the ticket cost).



The event is designed to gather people involved in worship and outreach and offer ideas and resources for music can enhance both church and community life.

The Friday Evening Worship Event

This will be a place where we try to model ways that local churches could host worship, making use of local musicians (and other artists) in ways that are attractive and accessible for local people not already part of the church. We will then invite those who wish to remain after the event to 'debrief' the evening, ask questions and reflect on how they might adapt the ideas. This in part is also to model the practice of debriefing worship – a very healthy thing that sadly we rarely do.

The Saturday Morning and Afternoon Event

This will be the 'main event' and consists of twelve workshop throughout the day and a time of closing worship. A full description of the workshops can be found here: http://www.churchofscotland.org.uk/worship/music_for_worship/different_voices/national_music_event

The Saturday Evening Event

This is primarily to gather as many musicians and non-musicians interested in the use of music for worship and outreach. We will explore ways we can work across the country, presbyteries or parishes in ways that support the work we do with music. We will harvest some good ideas that

will directly support, encourage and connect church musicians. Some ideas might be:

- a new Scottish hymn book of non-published/amateur music
- a regular slot on UCB radio for local praise bands, connecting writers with singers/musicians that could road test their new compositions
- connecting 'lone musicians' who struggle in a parish with others so that they could collaborate and enhance one another's musical contributions
- Our hope is that we will all leave with ideas of what we can be doing locally to resource one another, as well as some big ideas of how we could collaborate regionally and Nationally too.

Some of those involved are:

Noel Richards – International Worship Leader, and writer of 'All Heaven Declares' Enabling Contemporary Worship

John L. Bell – of the Wild Goose Resource Group and Iona Community Singing for Everyone

Paul Mealor – Reader in Composition at the University of Aberdeen and Composer of 'Ubi Caritas' for the Royal Wedding Ceremony. Composition in Worship and Outreach

Fischy Music – Peerless Pioneers of Children's music for churches, schools and families.

We will also be joined by the National Youth Choir of Scotland, New Scottish Arts, John Kitchen, Origin Scotland, Givin' it Laldae and other contributors. Workshops will include song writing, improvised music, developing musicality in toddlers, music with people with dementia, change management in church music, AV clinics, Scottish Rap, and how to play hymns meaningfully.
